#### ARTIST OPEN CALL: MEHFIL-CÈILIDH

#### AN INTERNATIONAL CULTURAL EXCHANGE BETWEEN LOCHALSH & SKYE, AND ISLAMABAD, RAWALPINDI & LAHORE IN APRIL AND MAY 2025

School of Sociology, Quaid-i-Azam University is excited to announce a new open call opportunity for three Pakistan based artists to take part in a fully funded international creative and cultural exchange, connecting artists from Islamabad, Rawalpindi and Lahore in Pakistan, with artists in Skye/Lochalsh, Scotland, UK.

The Mehfil-Cèilidh project is an international cultural exchange, that aims to build relationships between two vibrant and distinct communities: the islands and mainland of Lochalsh and Skye in Scotland, and the cities of Islamabad, Rawalpindi, and Lahore in Pakistan. By exploring themes of cultural memory, conviviality, and connection, we hope to foster creative collaborations that celebrate the rich artistic traditions and cultural practices of both regions.

This exchange centers around the idea of a 'Mehfil-Cèilidh'—a bringing together of two traditions. In Pakistan, a 'Mehfil' is an Urdu word that means gathering or assembly, typically for the purpose of enjoying music, poetry, or other forms of art. In Scotland, a 'Cèilidh' means "visit" or "gathering" in Gàidhlig, and refers to a gathering often including storytelling, poetry, music, and dancing. Both customs create spaces for collective celebration, storytelling, and the exchange of ideas. During the exchange, you will have the opportunity to contribute to this shared experience and collaborate with artists from both regions, creating new connections through art, culture, and conversation.

The exchange will involve a series of online sessions spanning 6 months, and a seven-day trip to the UK (where a group of five artists and cultural workers will travel to Skye/ Lochalsh and participate in various cultural activities and artistic workshops hosted by the project team from the UK). Similarly, the Pakistan team will host a **six-day visit** here, welcoming the UK team to share their practices and experiences with the local community.

This project is in partnership School of Sociology, Quaid-i-Azam University, Pakistan and Atlas Art, Scotland, UK, funded by the British Council's International Collaboration Grants, and invites artists and creative practitioners to explore shared (and different) traditions of storytelling, music, dance, and cultural expression.

Who will be travelling? The three artists chosen from the open call will join Pakistan team's members Mamoona Khan and Muhammad Ibrahim (the initiators of this project), who will together travel to the UK for one week, after collectively hosting a six-day visit to Pakistan for five artists from the UK.

When? The visits will take place in Pakistan in April 2025 and in Skye in May 2025, with online meetings and sharing from February 2025.

#### What's Included?

**Artist fee:** Artists will be paid the following:

Participation in a 7-day trip to UK in May 2025

- Joining and helping to host a visit for the UK team in Pakistan for 6 full days in April 2025
- Planning and hosting 6 days of activities (such as hosting a talk, sharing, walk, music session, workshop etc) as part of the 6-day Pakistan trip

6 x 1-hour online sessions, between February–July 2025.

Post-project Evaluation

All Travel and Accommodation: In addition to the artist fee, all travel, visa, accommodation, food, and related expenses will be covered, and arranged for residency in the UK.

**Support**: School of Sociology, Quaid-i-Azam University will provide full support, including assistance with visas, travel arrangements, event organizing, access support, hosting, and logistical coordination. A budget will be also available for you to share your work in Pakistan.

Who can apply? Applications are welcome from a wide range of practices such as visual artists, musicians, dancers, poets, storytellers, writers, craftspersons and artisans. For travelling groups to UK artists focusing on traditional tabla playing music, and continuity stone carving artists will be preferred. Whether your practice is rooted in traditional or contemporary forms, we invite you to apply if you are interested in connecting with others and sharing your creative passion. Women artists are encouraged to apply.

#### To be eligible to take part you should:

Hold a Pakistani passport

Have a strong connection with local traditions and art.

 Possess significant connection to traditional stone carving art and/or tabla playing, Have a strong desire to share and learn through this international cultural exchange opportunity

· with the primary outcomes supporting creative and artistic work with reasonable skill and care and to the highest professional standards,

• Be available in April and May 2025 to join both trips in their entirety

Be available to join 6 x 1 hour long meetings online between February and July 2025

Meet the entry requirements for travel to the UK.

Be up for hosting activities or sharing for up to six days during the UK team's trip to Pakistan.

Must be over the age of 18 by October 2024

**How to Apply?** To apply, please submit a statement, which responds to the following points (maximum 1000 words):

- 1. Your creative practice, approach, and areas of interest (max 300 words)
- 2. Why you are interested in participating in this exchange (max 300 words)3. What would you like to bring and share to the Mehfil-Ceilidh (max 300 words)

4. Confirmation that you meet the above eligibility criteria. (max 100 wrods)

Please share two or three examples of your work (this can be in any format ie. attached image, video link, website, social media)

If you prefer, you may submit an alternative format, such as a short video or audio recording (no longer than five minutes), instead of a written statement.
